- 7. Update on grants- Greg Piklapp was not present so there was no discussion
- 8. Update on Heart of Iowa Nature Trail- the Destination Iowa Grant was approved by the State of Iowa in the amount of \$1.5 million, this will pave the trail all the way to Collins, Story County has pledged \$3 million, and another \$400,000 in grants has been raised. This project should be complete within 2 years rather than the original 10-15 year timeline.
- 9. Proposal by Tonia Hopkin for a street light to be installed on Main Street between 3<sup>rd</sup> Street and 4<sup>th</sup> Street-At the last council meeting, it was decided to ask Alliant if they could do light mapping to see if repositioning the lights at 3<sup>rd</sup> and Main and 4<sup>th</sup> and Main would help light the street, rather than installing a new street light since there is opposition by one neighbor. Alliant doesn't do light mapping but they tried to reposition the lights to see if that would help, but they couldn't reposition the lights as

one is a steel pole and the other one is already pointing toward that section of street. After much discussion, it was agreed upon by council and all interested parties for the city to get price quotes for solar lights that can be placed in that dark area. Motion by Pasquariello, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Welch, All Ayes, M/C. Price quotes will be presented at the April council meeting.

- 10. Discussed social media and advertising opportunities for the city- Amber Busall was not present so there was no discussion
- 11. Motion by Pasquariello to approve an exemption of the weight restriction on 2<sup>nd</sup> Street in order to allow Collins-Maxwell school busses the privilege to utilize 2<sup>nd</sup> Street so the school district can add a bus stop at Tootsie Pops Daycare, which is a state-registered childcare development home, located at 212 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Kennedy, All Ayes, M/C. Mayor spoke with Superintendent Grandon via speakerphone to express the City of Collins's support of adding this bus stop.
- 12. Motion by Kennedy to approve exemption of paying monthly minimum sewer fees at 308 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue until July 1, 2023, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Howell, All Ayes, M/C. Clerk will start charging garbage, recycling, and lagoon fees now, and will start charging sewer fees July 1.
- 13. Motion by Howell to table until the April council meeting- request for an exemption that would allow the Collins-Maxwell CSD to bring the bus barn 10 feet from the east side of the tennis courts, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Kennedy, All Ayes, M/C. This agenda item was revisited later in the meeting after speaking with Superintendent Chad Grandon via speakerphone. Motion by Kennedy to approve the request for an exemption that would allow the C-M CSD to bring the bus barn 10 feet from the east side of the tennis courts, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Pasquariello, All Ayes, M/C.
- 14. Reviewed/discussed 28E agreement between the Collins-Maxwell CSD and the City of Collins- Mayor spoke with Superintendent Grandon via speakerphone, and they will work together to review and update the agreement
- 15. Discussed the possibility of the school district assuming ½ of the responsibility for insurance coverage of baseball and softball fields- Mayor spoke with Superintendent Grandon via speakerphone, and they will work together to review and discuss this
- 16. Motion by Kennedy to approve 111 3<sup>rd</sup> Street house demolition, if Elliot Earthworks can do it for \$7,000 which is budgeted with TIF funds, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Howell, Roll Call- All Ayes, M/C
- 17. Motion by Howell to approve Resolution 2023-3. "Resolution approving the purchase of materials for the 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue culvert project", 2<sup>nd</sup> by Pasquariello, Roll Call- All Ayes, M/C
